Without our sponsors we would not be able to offer the huge inflatable family fun zone free. This area is just one of the many free activities and offers many activities for all ages. We pay \$2,000 for the inflatables, generators, and staff. Of course there are other expenses such as \$1,000 event insurance, paid parking attendants, overnight security and more.

Sponsorship money, profit reserves from prior Cherohala Skyway Festivals, and an \$87,000 grant from the Tennessee State Museum allowed us to fund the new pavement and gravel that tripled the number of parking spaces at the Hall Museum. The additional parking, along with a music stage currently being built through donations, will benefit not only the Hall Museum but also the many groups who visit for tours, attend museum events, participate in town events, and the guests of the Monroe County Visitor's Center located next door. These improvements also serve the broader community and school groups that make use of the Hall Museum.

The Hall Museum recently received grant funding to help build a pavilion alongside Building 2. This pavilion will house an outdoor classroom with a focus on the arts, provide storage space, and shelter several historic relics—including a wagon used in the first 1958 Wagon Train, a wagon last used by the Hall and Myers family, a 1900 buggy from a local family, farm implements, and the first fire truck purchased by the town of Tellico Plains in the 1950s.

To complete the first phases of this project, we will need to raise an additional \$50,000. Any reserves after festival expenses will go toward this project. Will you join us in continuing to preserve and celebrate our historical relics, documents, and pictures?
